This *Bibliography* includes material relating to the history of science in Australia, New Zealand, New Guinea and other islands of the Pacific Ocean near Australia, and Antarctica. In scope, the *Bibliography* covers publications in the natural sciences (mathematics, physical sciences, earth sciences and biological sciences), some of the applied sciences (including medical and health sciences, agriculture, manufacturing and engineering) and human sciences (anthropology and psychology). Biographical material on practitioners in these sciences is also of interest.

In compiling this *Bibliography* over 200 journals were scanned for citations for articles, books and book reviews on subjects covered. The resources of the Library at The University of Melbourne and the State Library of Victoria were invaluable in finding significant publications. Library catalogs, particularly those of the National Library of Australia and the National Library of New Zealand Te Papa Mātauranga O Aotearoa, were useful sources of relevant material.

Thanks are due to those people who sent items or information about newly-published items for inclusion in the *Bibliography*, particularly Professor Rod Home. Thanks are also due to the staff of the eScholarship Research Centre at The University of Melbourne, especially Helen Morgan and Ailie Smith. Dr Monika Wells provided valuable assistance in identifying necessary amendments and corrections. Readers are encouraged to send information on the publication of books, journal articles, conference papers, reports, Master's and PhD theses and reviews on the subject published during 2016 for inclusion in the next *Bibliography*.
