Probe:

- How long has goat raising been practiced in the village?

2. What motivated your household to begin raising goats?

Probe:

• Whether other goat raisers/traders had influence over their decision to begin raising goats.

3. How did you acquire the goats?

Probe:

- Who they sourced goats from.
- How they financed the goats.
- Did they make a trade? Pay in cash? Was the goat gifted?
- Are they in cash or gift debt to whoever they acquired from?
