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The electrochemical technique CLE-AdSV is widely used to quantify binding constants of metal complexes. Measurements are made upon addition of an excess of an adsorptive ligand L<sub>ad</sub> which competes with other ligands L. Iron may be complexed by water and hydroxide (top structures) and water-borne organic material (bottom structures). Have measurements with this techique been misinterpreted? 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Fireworks inject a number of chemicals into the atmosphere in a brief time and over a small space. This highly localized 'patch' could allow validation of satellite-based measurements against ground measurements, as described by Williams and coworkers (p. 94).

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
