# From the President's Desk

Recently I travelled to Macau to attend the APSIC 2009 conference\*. Apart from conference attendance being an important part of professional development, participation can open your eyes to a new way of doing things or re-visiting an age old problem with renewed vigour. Then primary purpose of my attendance was to raise the profile of AICA and the *Healthcare Infection* journal through discussion with peers, involvement in regional discussions and meetings with keynote speakers and, industry leaders including company representatives.

In many respects AICA is well placed to be a leader in the field through expanded regional readership and submission of articles to *Healthcare Infection*, but in other areas we experience the same difficulties as neighbouring countries particularly when we begin to discuss how to achieve a better understanding of the role and scope of the Infection Control Professional. Of note was a session dedicated to WHO activities regarding infection prevention and control. I listened with keen interest to presentations of colleagues from Thailand, Vietnam and WHO headquarters, Geneva as essential components and building blocks of infection prevention and control were discussed.

Over the past 18 months AICA has worked in collaboration with the ACSQHC (the Commission) to improve surveillance, antibiotic stewardship, infection prevention and control guidelines and, in establishing elements of an effective infection control program. We are fortunate that we have this avenue of collaboration and support and should embrace these opportunities.

# **South Australia**

#### State Infection Control Conference

ICASA held its second biennial conference in Adelaide on Friday August 14th at The Lakes Resort, Westlakes. The conference was well attended by ICASA members and non members with an interest in infection prevention and control with over 150 people attending (including trade).

The theme "Change...the same only different" was apt as South Australia is currently going through changes both at a national, state and regional level. The impact of the economic crisis presented some additional challenges for infection prevention and control having to balance best practice options for infection prevention strategies with the finite resource of the healthcare dollar.

The invited and abstract speakers provided an opportunity to discuss the challenges in developing contemporary strategies to improve healthcare not only within Australia but in other nations such as the United Kingdom and Europe. We were given insightful opportunities to learn not only how to engage our healthcare workers but the wider community in simple practices such as hand hygiene, that can significantly assist with reducing opportunities for disease transmission. As we learnt some changes may mean returning to old ideas, while others may challenge our understanding and take us out of our comfort zone. But the one mission remains; prevention and control of infections.

#### Post Conference Workshops

There were workshops held post conference on the Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> of August, and one that I know that I thoroughly enjoyed when I undertook it in the past, was the Blood Borne Virus Exposure Management run by Philip Melling. The epidemiologists were keen to understand Mathematical Modelling and how they could apply it into their everyday practice within public health.

The ICASA Executive Committee would also like to take the opportunity to thank the 35 exhibitors at the conference, in especially our Gold, Silver and Bronze Sponsors.

The committee would also like to take the opportunity to thank BBraun in providing two scholarships. These scholarships helped to support two infection control link nurses to attend the conference. An opportunity they may not have had through their facility and one that they will share with the ICASA members in the next ICASA newsletter.

The conference represented excellent value for money, with early bird non member registration commencing only \$195. The invited speaker list was exceptional and TICA would like to thank all the speakers for their valuable time and effort in supporting our conference. All sponsorship opportunities were taken by industry, including gold, silver and bronze level sponsorship. #### 2009 Membership

The TICA has had a record amount of memberships this year.

#### Infection Control Strategy

The Tasmanian Infection Prevention & Control Unit (TIPCU) in conjunction with the Office of the Chief Nursing Officer in the DHHS are developing a state wide strategy for the prevention of healthcare associated infection. TICA are involved in this process and welcome a state wide strategic direction in this area. Many elements of the strategy are thought provoking and challenging but are necessary. Some elements include:

- 1. Stronger governance and reporting arranging
- 2. Specifications regarding infection control education for DHHS staff
- 3. Minimum skills/qualifications for staff working in infection control

#### **Current TICA Developments**

#### New Website

At the TICA conference, the TICA website was launched. The web address is <u>www.thetica.net.au</u>. The website contains a wealth of information for TICA members, including a member's only section. In future, the TICA Exec is hoping that online payments such as membership subscription can be made from the website. The TICA has secured sponsorship for the website

#### New Scholarships/Support for Members

Next year, the TICA are offering <u>additional</u> <u>scholarship/educational support</u> to members. This includes

- Financial support for flights, for <u>five</u> TICA members to attend the AICA conference (in addition to 5 early bird registrations)
- A new \$500 scholarship for TICA members

#### Other news

- The TICA membership passed a resolution to accept new rules for TICA. The rule changes were significant and are designed to improve the transparency, flexibility and accountability within the TICA. Examples include appointment and removal of TICA Executive members, consultancy and external communication.
- The President of the TICA is expecting that the current TICA Exec become AICA credentialed. In addition, the TICA Exec are offering support to TICA members who wish to become credentialed.
- At recent GMs, TICA members have had discussions about position statements, relevant to Tasmania. Generally, TICA members are wanting this to occur. As a result, the TICA Exec are developing online surveys, so that such statements can be developed and to ensure that the TICA Exec respond to media issues appropriately.
- TICA members have also discussed at GMs the need for the TICA to have more a voice in Tasmania. To support this, the TICA Exec have developed media response guidelines and will respond to media issues as supported by the above point. Additionally, the TICA are considering other options.

# AICA Area of Expertise Database (AED) INFORMATION SHEET

## Why is the AICA AED required ?

Many members would be aware that AICA liaises with a great number of external bodies such as the Commonwealth Government, State Governments, Australian Standards, Universities, NGOs and other agencies. Each of these bodies request AICA's participation in document development or reviews.

## What is the AICA AED ?

In late 2008 the AICA Executive developed a project brief for the AICA AED. The brief is to establish and maintain the AICA AED. The aim is to respond to requests for AICA consultation through the provision of specialist Infection Prevention and Control knowledge available from the AICA AED members. These members can then represent AICA on these external bodies.

Initially the Database will be for 12 months (May 2009 to May 2010), with review at the end of this period.

## Who is eligible to be listed on the AICA AED ?

An AICA AED member is a, or has:

- Credentialled Infection Control Professional, or
- Infection prevention and control qualifications, or
- 5 years of experience within a specific infection prevention and control field within. Such fields can include, but are not limited to:
  - Environmental Health;
  - Surveillance;
  - Strategic Planning;
  - Wound Care;
  - Sterilizing;

- Antimicrobial control;
  Education;
  - Aged Care;
  - Aged Care;
- Policy writing.

## What is required from an AICA AED listed member?

The level of participation and content input required for AICA participation varies. Based on past experiences this can vary from a 1 hour document review to 12 month membership on a government committee.

Members of the expert database would be contacted following a request to AICA from an external agency for AICA representation or consultation. The AICA Executive would determine who may be best suited for the request and will then approach the member to identify their availability.

## How do I apply to be listed on the AICA AED ?

To apply for AICA AED membership please submit your current CV and area of infection prevention and control expertise, with supporting evidence to AICA via: <u>admin@aica.org.au</u>

This database will be administered by AICA and will remain confidential with access limited to the AICA Executive when required.
