News and Notes

Mr. David Purchase will succeed Mr. Warren Hitchcock as Secretary of the Australian Bird-banding Scheme as from January 1, 1967. Mr. Purchase joined the CSIRO Division of Wildlife Research in 1957 and soon became closely associated with batbanding, then in its infancy in Australia. In 1962 he resigned from Wildlife, on appointment as a Biologist with ANARE, and spent a total of 29 months, between December 1962 and March 1966, on Macquarie Island, where he worked on the Royal Penguina long-term population study involving a large-scale banding programme. He also took the opportunity to study certain aspects of population regulation in the Southern Skua, a highly territorial species that lends itself to a study of this nature.
