THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE RAOU NEST RECORD SCHEME

INTRODUCTION

The total of 1,651 cards returned for the 1976–77 season is the lowest since 1969–70. It appears that this is because the contributors to the Scheme have decreased. The average return per contributor (30 cards) is equivalent to the previous season (31 cards). This tends to suggest that there was no significant difference in nesting activity between the two seasons.

In the return of 1,651 cards, seventy-six were submitted for the past two seasons: nine for 1974-75 and sixty-seven for 1975-76. Thus, the totals for previous years have been altered.

Totals for four species were substantially increased: by R. J. and M. N. Brown, who sent in twenty-six cards for the Coot; P. Dann and K. Lowe, thirty-five for the Blackbird; and S. Marchant, thirty-eight for the Yellow-faced Honeyeater and thirty-seven for the Eastern Yellow Robin.

Outstanding contributions came from S. Marchant (Moruya, NSW) who sent in 222 cards, R. J. and M. N. Brown (Manjimup, WA), whose contribution numbered 141 cards, and S. Unthank (Moorooduc, Vic.) who made a substantial return of 116 cards to the scheme.

All contributors are listed below and thanked for their encouragement, interest and hard work during the year. Fifty individuals and four corporate bodies contributed to the scheme and these are listed in Table 1.

RESULTS

The total number of cards in the collection is now 27,882 and the annual totals are as follows:
