Inaugural conference of the Australasian Section of the Society for Conservation Biology

The inaugural meeting of the Australasian region of SCB "The Biodiversity Extinction Crisis, a Pacific and Australasian Response" will be held July 10–13 2007 at the University of New South Wales, Sydney. There will be five major themes: (1) Regional challenges (particular issues for our part of the world); (2) Managing threatening process of universal importance; (3) Case studies of conservation in action, including biodiversity monitoring and assessment; (4) Conservation science and policy; and (5) Conservation science and the community (non-government organizations, indigenous people). Not only is your attendance important to the success of the conference, but it is your opportunity to be heard on issues as important as water allocation for environmental flows in Australia, biodiversity conservation in the Southern Oceans, climate change and the allocation of resources to threatened species management.

Student Prizes

The Society for Conservation Biology Australasia (SCB-A) Section provided a student award for "Best Talk on a Conservation Topic" at the 2006 Australasian Wildlife Management Society Conference, held in Auckland, New Zealand 4–6 December 2006. Jennifer Germano, a doctoral student in the Zoology Department at the University of Otago in Dunedin, won the award with her presentation on amphibian and reptile re-introductions, translocations, and supplementations. The award — a two-year membership to the SCB and a two-year subscription to *Conservation Biology* — was presented on behalf of SCB-A by conference organizer Dave Choquenot from Landcare Research.
