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ON FRONT COVER: Wandoo woodland at Dryandra in Western Australia: The wandoo woodlands at Dryandra are one of the largest and least disturbed remnants of this formerly widespread community. They sustain a unique assemblage of threatened fauna which includes Numbats, Woylies, Rufous Treecreepers, Malleefowl and Yellow-throated Honeyeaters. However, conservation of much of this fauna requires the control of the European Fox. To do this, Western Australia has initiated a high profile programme of fox control called "Western Shield". Western Shield has not only assisted in the recovery of animals like the Numbat, but has promoted wildlife conservation and management among the Western Australian public. Similar programmes could be initiated in other states with equal benefit to biological conservation.
