The Australian Community Health Association to Lose Federal Funding

Health Minister Michael Wooldridge has decided ACHA will no longer receive funding from the Community Sector Support Scheme from 30 September 1997.

ACHA is one of five organisations that have been defunded. Others are:

- Australian Pensioners and Superannuants Federation;
- · Family Planning Australia;
- Australian Catholic Welfare Commission Natural Family Planning Secretariat; and
- Association of Civilian Widows.

Four other organisations, GROW, Australian National Association for Mental Health, Australian Psychiatric Disability Coalition, and National Youth Coalition for Housing have been put on interim funding until 30 June 1998.

ACHA sought some explanation from the Minister's office for this decision, and it was told that it is a matter of priorities. ACHA is awaiting a written response. Without Community Sector Support Scheme (CSSS) funds, it is very difficult for ACHA to maintain staff and its national secretariat. ACHA will be seeking alternative funds, but core funds these days are difficult to find.

Australia has just produced its contribution to the World Health Organization's Third Evaluation of the Health for All Strategy. Australia's document says this country is committed specifically to 'support for a strong primary health care system that is integrated into the broader health system'. Yet the government has defunded the one organisation with a national perspective on primary health care issues.
