## GENERAL AIMS AND OBJECTS

Formation of the Association

In forming this Association the founders had in mind the need to create a body whose prime function was to help Australia to self-sufficiency through the discovery of commercial oil, and generally to promote and develop the interests of the Australian petroleum industry.

Clearly a first opportunity to advance this objective lay in unifying the activities of companies not otherwise organised or united, who had the same objectives. A continuing task is the co-ordination of thinking and activities which will be necessary in this fast-developing industry of oil exploration and the presentation of a united front in connection with public and governmental relationships.

The Association has provided a meltingpot for ideas and policies, out of which it has evolved its own. It represents an informed and united body of opinion; and whilst it obviously represents the collective interests of its membership, it does not sponsor policies based on individual selfinterest.

#### Promotion of Sound Practice and Ethics

The Association is intent upon seeing that the best experience of other oil-producing nations is carefully studied and incorporated into Australian oilfield and industry practices.

It is desirous of promoting the industry upon sound well-established principles and of introducing a code of ethics acceptable to the industry throughout Australia and overseas.

It is designed to protect and preserve the interests of persons, firms and companies solely or principally engaged in the business of exploring for producing and refining petroleum in Australia.

Education of the Public

It is also intent upon the proper education of the Australian public in relation to oil exploration, production and development generally and with promotion of a high degree of confidence between members of the public and the industry.

Advancement of Modern Scientific Methods The Association takes an active part in the distribution of information regarding new scientific approaches and methods and has sponsored special courses in well logging (by Schlumberger) and hydrodynamics (by Petroleum Research Corporation) and holds a conference annually at which papers are presented on petroleum geology, exploration methods and oilfield practice. These Papers are subsequently published for the Association in this Journal and other publications

# Maintenance of Good Relations with Governments

It is most desirable that Government legislation and regulations which affect the industry should be based on sound principles and practice. Such governmental policies are necessary to ensure satisfactory investment (and re-investment) for Australia to become self-sufficient in petroleum and thereby alleviate the pressing economic and defence problems caused by our complete dependence on imported crude oil. The Association maintains a close connection with Government Departments in this respect and presents the industry's viewpoints to the best advantage.

Membership

Those exploration companies, service companies and persons engaged in the exploration industry who are not members of the Association are invited to seek information regarding membership. Although most of the Australian exploration companies and many service companies are members, the Association wishes to maintain the broadest membership possible.

FULL MEMBERSHIP is available to any bona fide explorer for oil or any companies, firms or persons having registered in their name any authority, permit or licence to prospect for petroleum in Australia, or having a participation in such.

ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP (non-voting) is available to service companies and similar organisations and to individuals with interests in petroleum exploration or any affiliated business or activity.

Membership is subject to the approval of the Council of the Association.
