This bibliography includes citations of material relating to the history of science and technology in the Australasian region. Geographic areas covered include Australia, Antarctica, New Zealand, New Guinea and islands close to Australia. Science and technology are interpreted widely to include the natural sciences (physical, earth and biological sciences); some of the applied sciences (including medical and health sciences, agriculture and related subjects, and engineering); and human sciences (anthropology and psychology). Biographical references are of particular importance.

Sources used in compiling the bibliography include an extensive range of journals and the digital resources of several of Australia's most comprehensive libraries. Citations range from books and reviews to journal articles and sections from encyclopaedic works. Other material that may find a place in future bibliographies includes theses and electronic publications.

Assistance in compiling the bibliography has come from several sources and proved invaluable. In particular, Tom Darragh, Gavan McCarthy and Ken McInnes were most helpful, as was Monika Wells who invariably finds errors that the compiler misses. Readers are urged to let the compiler know about their own publications and others of which they may be aware: they probably have sources of information that have escaped the compiler.
