Little Crow in the Northern Territory.—The Little Crow (Corvus bennetti) is not included in H. T. Condon's recent 'List of the Birds of the Northern Territory' (S.A. Naturalist, 23 (1), 8-10, 1945). In November 1905, William Stalker collected a male at Alexandria, which has been recorded by Collingwood Ingram (Ibis, ser. 9, vol. 3, 618, 1909), and this is apparently the small Crow tabulated by Col. R. Meinertzhagen (Novitates Zoologicae, XXXIII, 120, 1926). Alexandria and Tundi-eji Waterholes are the furthest north localities that the species is known to inhabit in the State. Capt. S. A. White (Trans. Royal Soc. Sth. Aust., XXXVIII, 438; 1914) has recorded it from the Central Highlands, and A. G. Campbell (*Emu*, 29, 104, 1929) lists a male from Charlotte Waters. The latter specimen, owing to its large size, should be re-examined.

In the South Australian Museum is a male skin (no. B13727) which was, I believe, taken by Prof. J. B. Cleland, at Macdonald Downs, Central Australia, on September 6, 1930.

The distribution of the Little Crow in the Northern Territory almost certainly covers most of the Central Highlands and the desert scrub regions.—ERHARD F. BOEHM, Sutherlands, S.A., 3/12/45.
