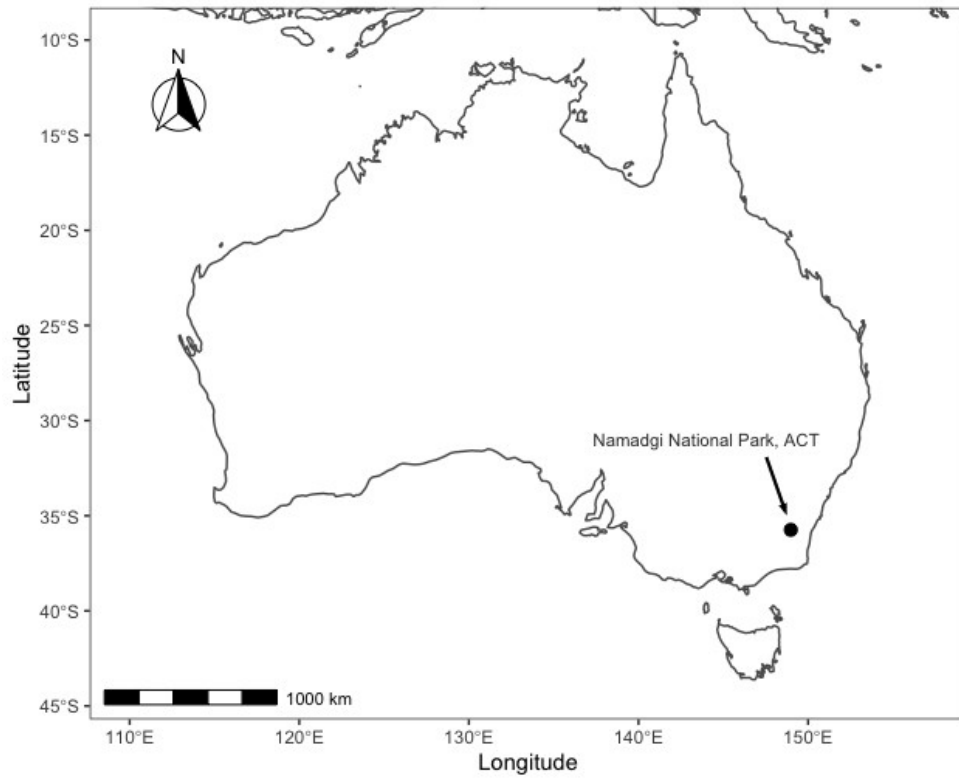


Figure S1. Observations were made in Namadgi National Park in the Australian Capital Territory (ACT) situated in the south-eastern region of Australia.
