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Fig. S1. General appearance of the study area 9 months after the wildfire. Fire consumed all the leaves, twigs, litter and understorey vegetation, and charred the bark of the trunks. Flames reached and consumed the crown of the trees (~8 m high). Fire was classified as a high-severity crown fire by the Forest Service.
