On this note, we are very pleased to announce that Dr Marc-André Parisien is the winner of the Outstanding Editor Award of the *International Journal of Wildland Fire* for 2021. Marc is a research scientist at the Canadian Forest Service, Northern Forestry Centre, (Edmonton, Alberta) where he has been working with the fire research group since 2000. He was trained as a forest ecologist and holds a B.Sc. from McGill University, an M.Sc. from l'Université du Québec à Rimouski, and a Ph.D. from the University of California, Berkeley. His research on wildland fire is focused on understanding biophysical controls on fire regimes, mostly within the boreal biome of North America. He specialises in quantitative analysis methods, including process-based simulation modelling, a tool he uses for mapping wildfire likelihood.

Marc has been an Associate Editor of the *International Journal of Wildland Fire* since 2010. We are pleased to add the 2021 IJWF Outstanding Editor Award to his impressive list of achievements, and we most whole-heartedly thank him for his exceptional service to *International Journal of Wildland Fire*.
