Interview Guide

Dimensions of Human-Mountain Goat Interactions in Cathedral Provincial Park: Interview Guide for Staff or Experienced Visitors

All interview questions were informed by direct consultation with BC Parks' management and staff.

- 1) What is your position and or experience in the park? For how long have you held this position and/or had a presence in the park?
- 2) Have you encountered goats in the park?

Can you describe a typical goat encounter, or an encounter that stood out, that you have experienced?

- a. Did you have any direct interaction with the goats? What did the goats do, how did they behave? Did they notice you?
- b. What did you do, how did you behave?
- 3) Why do you think the goats are attracted to the lodge, camping, and visitor areas?
- 4) Have you noticed any changes in goat presence and behaviour over your time (working) in the park?
 - a. If yes, what is different between now and previous years? What has this change looked like over the time that you've been here?
- 5) Do you think the current messaging is effective in creating awareness of the goats and reducing human-goat interactions or encounters?
 - For example: Main sign boards on trails, Brochures on viewing mountain goats in the park, Signs located throughout the campground, Signs located in the bathrooms of the campground, Online information on the park's website, Information given by campground or lodge staff.
- 6) What do you think is/could be the most effective method to create awareness of the goats and to reduce human-goat interaction? E.g., More signage/messaging, clear instruction upon arrival to the park, pamphlets/brochures
